We have a new completed mural in the narthex (entry way) of St. Luke's. The mural was blessed on our Annual Meeting Sunday, January 23. Amy Colburn, an artist from Canandaigua, painted the mural which depicts the buildings our congregation has occupied, our sanctuary cross, and mission statement. 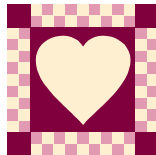
